

HISTORICAL BACKGROUND



On June 26, 1997, a group of 14 farmers from Karagwe District, led by Mr. Leonard Kachebonaho, came together to discuss how they could help smallholder farmers in Karagwe District get out of poverty. On May 15, 1998, registered a tool that would lead them to achieve their mission.

HISTORICAL BACKGROUND



This tool was called Karagwe Development and Relief Services (KADERES)



Our Mission

To see an empowered community of Karagwe and Kyerwa Districts in which people effectively manage their own lives.



Our Vision

To capacitate the Karagwe and Kyerwa community to fight against poverty through the facilitation of socio-economic programs in a sustainable way. As a result of the good work done by KADERES, in 2008 they set up a company with the aim of buying, processing, and selling grains and other farmers' products.

Since its establishment, KPD PLC has focused on giving smallholder farmers a chance to become part of the company's ownership, as well as helping them to secure a fair price for their crops, earn dividends from their businesses as part of their incentives, and also encourage them to produce their crops on the basis of agribusiness and to get rid of subsistence farming.

Establishment of Agro forestry Development Centre



A total of 5,845,250 tree seedlings were distributed to 11,345 farmers under the Agroforestry Centre, and planted their trees on over 7,563 ha.

Success Stories



I got 2,600,000 Tshs and bought a cow for 1,100,000 Tshs, the cow was pregnant, and when I brought it home, it gave birth to a male calf; I sold it for Sh450,000. We get some milk, and every day we drink three liters. Of those, one we sell and two we drink.

I got 3,200,000 Tshs on my 5-acre farm. I made a small amount of money and bought a milling machine, and now I am doing business here in the village. From this machine, I get a nap for my chickens, ducks, and cows. Every day, the machine gives me money, the cows give me milk and money, and the chickens give me eggs and money. I don't miss 1,500 Tsh per day.

I got 1,200,000 Tshs, and from this amount, I took 900,000 Tshs and bought a fried bread (mandazi) production machine. I now produce 700 pieces of mandazi daily, and my income has increased greatly, I earn between 70,000 and 80,000 Tshs a day. I have hired four young guys sell mandazi in the villages. The market is huge. When I get money, I will buy a motorcycle to expand the market.

I got 362,000 Tshs, of which I spent on buying three goats. I get manure. This project has motivated me to plant many fruit trees; so far, I have planted more than 1000 different fruits. The benefits are enormous; my family can access some fruits, and the rest we sell to get cash for improving our meals.

I got 1,800,000 Tshs on my 8-acre farm. I bought a motorcycle to reduce the cost of transportation I spend on my farm activities.

I saved a lot of money until I managed to buy a Pool Table to raise income. I earn between 20,000 Shs to 30,000 Tshs per day.

Kamuli Jeremia



I got 4,4548 Tshs, on my 10-acre farm. It was a huge amount of money in my life. I always earn a lot of money, but not at once like this. We directed this money to the construction of a business building with four rooms, two of which I use and two for rent. I get 100,000 Shs for rent.
